Rent A Program Area - Would your unit like to use Handicraft for an evening to make patrol flags? Perhaps your troop would like to use Waterfront for a Polar Bear swim or a canoeing skills development session? This is possible by simply "renting" a program area during special blocks of time throughout the week. Your Senior Patrol Leader will receive information concerning the method for program area rental during his meeting with the Commissioner Director Sunday evening. Think of the resources the different program areas of Ecology and Conservation, COPE, Field Sports, Handicraft, Outdoor Skills, and Waterfront can provide and use them in planning your troop's week at camp.

Remember! - There are certain program items that require the attendance of all in Camp Algonkin. These events include all meals in the Frank G. Hoover Dining Hall, all retreat ceremonies, and all campwide campfires. The Program Director will give you detailed explanations of these events during your stay.
